Report from Councillor Gillian Lemmon

Area One Forum 13th October at Scropton Village Hall

I attended and Chaired to Area Forum meeting that took place at Scropton Village Hall which was well attended by Council Officers and our Chief Executive. The highlights that were discussed include the following:

- Freeport Updates – Nothing has progressed since the last Area Forum but Councillors will be updated should there be any progress or updates as they are attending regular meetings with the various organisations that are involved.
- There has been a new PCO appointed in the area and they have started in post. There is now regular Skate Board Park presence after school given that there have been recent incidents. However, it was requested that any residents who witness or who are involved in anti-social behaviour should report incidents through the correct channels as PCO's will not be able to act or respond without following correct procedure. Facebook posts are not looked at by the Safer Neighbourhood Team. It was agreed that the team will send an official template to Hilton PC to use on Spotted Hilton and on the Hilton PC Facebook account to help residents navigate the correct procedure and report incidents correctly.
- Scooters cannot be confiscated 'on the spot' and again it is important to report their usage via the correct channels where the Safer Neighbourhood Team can then use their resources effectively.
- There is a £4k Fund available for Anti Social Behaviour projects via the District Council. The PC may have a project in mind and make an application.
- As Chair, I requested that our Chief Executive consider providing another drop-in session for the Local Plan to be held at a location in Hilton as the one in Etwall is not adequate given the population of Hilton village. I await an update on this, but it was confirmed that any resident will

be able to drop in at the Council Offices in Swadlincote every Tuesday and Wednesday room 2 PM until 4 PM to ask any questions. (Please see below update)

- Mobile Food Banks. Some astonishing statistics were shared about people within our villages and Ward who are registering for these services. Community Voluntary Services Officer said that she was looking into this and there may be an opportunity for a mobile service given the location of the one food bank being in Swadlincote. This does not serve our Ward and is far out of reach for many who need the service. I will update on any progress on this and may raise in the Housing and Community Committee if appropriate.

EV Charging Points

Hatton now has 8 new electric vehicle fast charging points in the SDDC public car park in Station Road.

The Emerging Local Plan

Your local consultation event which was held on Wednesday 26th October in Etwell, had great attendance with over 120 members of the public visiting the event. This number of attendees was more than double the number that attended the recent event held in Findern and clearly demonstrates that there is a justified need for an additional event to be held in Hilton, which Julie, Gillian and I have all been pushing for. It's sad to report that the controlling Group at SDDC still feel that events are not required, even though our requests have been supported by the Chief Exec of the Council and the Head of Planning.

Julie and I attended the event at different times during the session (unfortunately, Gillian was on holiday, so was unable to attend) and it was good to see local people that are interested and getting engaged about shaping of any possible further development of the area.

Whilst at the session I had agreement from Officers that any residents that do not have access to the internet can provide their contact information and postal address to SDDC via the Parish Council and District Councillors, who will then arrange for a hard copy pack to be sent out in the post for completion.

Pavements

Apologies for the delays with this, but I have been given a date of Dec/Jan for the work to be carried out.

Primary Schools/Secondary

Applications are now open for 2023. I would also encourage parents to check their eligibility for free school meals.

HGV Sat Nav's

We passed a motion at last full council for support for a total ban on HGV drivers using standard car sat nav's. The Leader of the Council is to write to the Secretary of State for Transport, calling on Government to take urgent action on this issue.

East Midlands Devolution Deal

Agreement to go ahead with public consultation for a EMCCA (East Midlands Combined County Authority) Devolution Deal was passed last week at Full Council. The deal with 4 authorities including Derbyshire, Derby City, Nottingham and Nottingham City as a new combined mayoral authority will see £38 million devolved from Government each year. Consultation with residents, boroughs, districts, parish councils and business begins 14th November until 9th January 2023.

DCC Budgets and Services

Have your say on the budgets and service's provided by DCC via the DCC website. This consultation closes on 13th November!

Household Support Fund

The latest tranche of money £5.4 million has been given to DCC to support families, pensioners and vulnerable people. It runs from now to 31st March 2023. Help for costs of food, energy and other essentials. Money will also be given to community groups, voluntary groups and charities to support our most vulnerable residents.

Warm Spaces Grant

DCC are giving grants to small community organisations who are providing warm spaces for residents in the community. Grants of up to £1,000 can be applied for to cover utilities costs or food and drink. Larger grants of £10,000 have been awarded to larger voluntary organisations to assist our residents during this difficult time.

Covid Rates

Covid rates are on the increase as well as flu as we head towards the winter season. For those who are eligible, please get your vaccinations and keep yourself protected.

Gritting

Our 35 lorries are all stationed ready for the winter. We have plenty of grit, so please get your orders in if bins need refilling in good time. All A roads, heavily used B roads, key bus routes and roads which link towns and villages will be gritted, some of these will be secondary routes and gritted on a needs basis.

Remembrance Sunday

We will all be attending the Remembrance Services across the area on Sunday 13th November to lay wreaths in commemoration of those that lost their lives in conflicts across the world.

Bird flu

All poultry and captive birds must be kept indoors to stop the spread of Avian flu. Suspected cases must be reported immediately by contacting national helpline 03888 200 301.
